DEMOGRAPHICS of the GREAT NEW ENGLAND AIR SHOW

Approximately 26 million people attend over 400 air shows annually. During the past decade, air shows rivaled NASCAR and NFL attendance. From the following information, based on an economic impact study of the 2008 Great New England Air Show by graduate students from the University of Massachusetts Department of Hospitality and Tourism Management, it is clear that GNEAS attendees are usually well educated and relatively affluent families.

In 2008, the average GNEAS attendee was a 45 year old male with a small (family) group of 3-4 individuals including children, traveling an average of 45 miles, who are highly interested in air shows. 57% of those polled said the primary reason for attending was their interest in aircraft and the second most popular reason (32%) was "entertainment for the family". GNEAS attendees indicated a high level of satisfaction with our event, with 77% indicating a "satisfied" or "very satisfied" rating. Of those polled, 85% indicated with a high level of certainty that they would return to the GNEAS.
